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AMERICAN RESCUE PLAN ACT CORONAVIRUS STATE AND LOCAL
FISCAL RECOVERY FUNDS**

WHEREAS, the Village of Montgomery (“Village”) is a municipal corporation of the State of Illinois located in Kane and Kendall Counties; and

WHEREAS, the American Rescue Plan Act provides for the Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds (the “Funds”) to provide relief to local governments adversely affected by the Coronavirus pandemic; and

WHEREAS, eligible state, city, village, and county governments may now request their allocation of the Funds; and

WHEREAS, the Funds may be used to support public health expenditures, address negative economic impacts caused by the public health emergency, replace lost public sector revenue, provide premium pay for essential workers, and invest in water, sewer, and broadband infrastructure; and

WHEREAS, the Village has determined that it is an eligible non-entitlement unit serving a population under 50,000 and eligible for Funds to be distributed by the State of Illinois;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Village President and the Board of Trustee of the Village of Montgomery, Kane and Kendall Counties, Illinois, as follows:

Section 1: Each of the recitals in the preamble set forth above are incorporated into Section 1 of this Resolution.

Section 2: That the President, Village Clerk, and Director of Finance are hereby authorized to execute and deliver an application, or complete an online portal process, for the receipt of the Funds, and any other documents necessary or convenient to complete the application process for the receipt of the Funds from the US Treasury, or the State of Illinois, and to provide any documentation as may be required for the dispersal of the Funds. Any prior actions taken to submit this application are hereby ratified.

Section 3: That upon receipt of any Funds the Village President, Village Clerk, and Director of Finance are authorized to establish a separate account as may be necessary to hold and disburse the Funds and to comply with required reporting requirements for the use of Funds.

Section 4: This Resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption as provided by law.

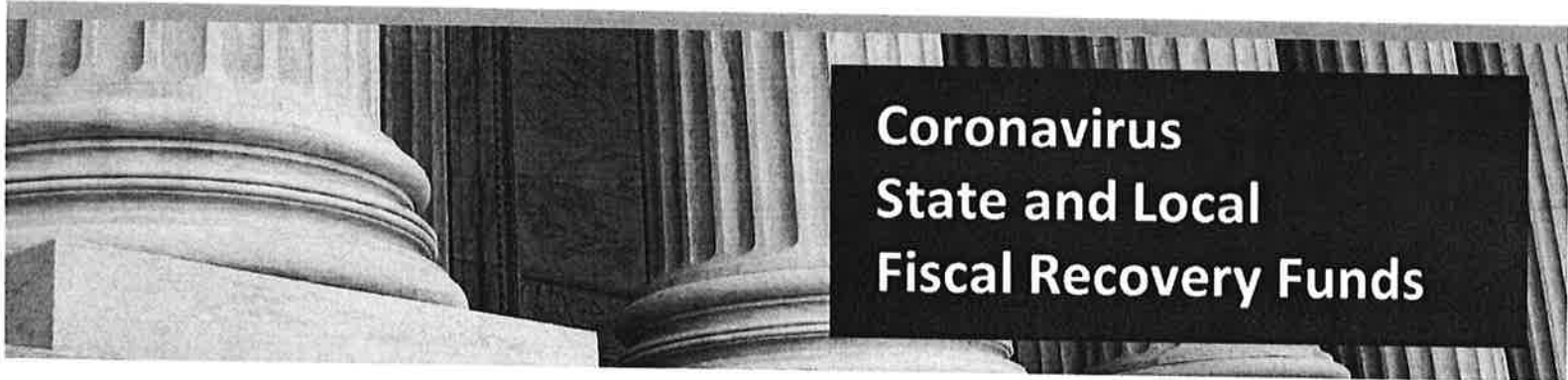

Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds

The American Rescue Plan will deliver \$350 billion for state, local, territorial, and Tribal governments to respond to the COVID-19 emergency and bring back jobs.

The Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds provide a substantial infusion of resources to help turn the tide on the pandemic, address its economic fallout, and lay the foundation for a strong and equitable recovery.

Funding Objectives

- **Support urgent COVID-19 response efforts** to continue to decrease spread of the virus and bring the pandemic under control
- **Replace lost public sector revenue** to strengthen support for vital public services and help retain jobs
- **Support immediate economic stabilization** for households and businesses
- **Address systemic public health and economic challenges** that have contributed to the inequal impact of the pandemic

Direct Recipients

- States and District of Columbia (\$195.3 billion)
- Counties (\$65.1 billion)
- Metropolitan cities (\$45.6 billion)
- Tribal governments (\$20.0 billion)
- Territories (\$4.5 billion)

Indirect Recipients

- Non-entitlement units (\$19.5 billion)



Support Public Health Response

Fund COVID-19 mitigation efforts, medical expenses, behavioral healthcare, and certain public health and safety staff



Address Negative Economic Impacts

Respond to economic harms to workers, families, small businesses, impacted industries, and the public sector



Replace Public Sector Revenue Loss

Use funds to provide government services to the extent of the reduction in revenue experienced due to the pandemic



Premium Pay for Essential Workers

Offer additional support to those who have and will bear the greatest health risks because of their service in critical infrastructure sectors



Water and Sewer Infrastructure

Make necessary investments to improve access to clean drinking water and invest in wastewater and stormwater infrastructure



Broadband Infrastructure

Make necessary investments to provide unserved or underserved locations with new or expanded broadband access



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
